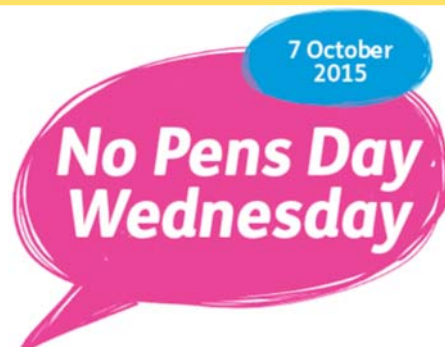
CURRICULUM EVENING
